

Eliot Phillipson received his M.D. with Distinction in 1963 from the University of Alberta. Following postgraduate training in Internal Medicine, he undertook research training at the Cardiovascular Research Institute, University of California San Francisco. In 1971 he took up an appointment at the University of Toronto as a clinician-scientist. From 1987-97 Dr. Phillipson served as Physician-in-Chief, Mount Sinai Hospital, Toronto. In 1993 he was appointed Sir John and Lady Eaton Professor and Chair, Department of Medicine, University of Toronto, and in 2004 assumed his current role as President and CEO of the Canada Foundation for Innovation, which funds infrastructure in Canadian research institutions. Dr. Phillipson is an elected member of the American Society for Clinical Investigation and Association of American Physicians, recipient of the Presidential Award of the European Respiratory Society, and holds an Honorary Doctor of Science from the University of Alberta.
